Let's bake...Milk and Honey Cakes

You will need:

- 2 tablespoons of melted butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons of runny honey
- 1 egg
- 10 tablespoons of self-raising flour
- 2 tablespoons of milk
- A pinch of cinnamon or mixed spice (optional)
- A mixing bowl
- 6 small cake cases
- A bun tin or baking tray.

What to do:

- In your bowl...
- Mix together the butter, honey, egg, and milk.
- Add the flour and cinnamon and mix until smooth.
- Spoon the mixture into the cake cases
- Cook at 180.C for 10 minutes
- Take out of oven and while warm drizzle a little honey over the cakes
- ENJOY!

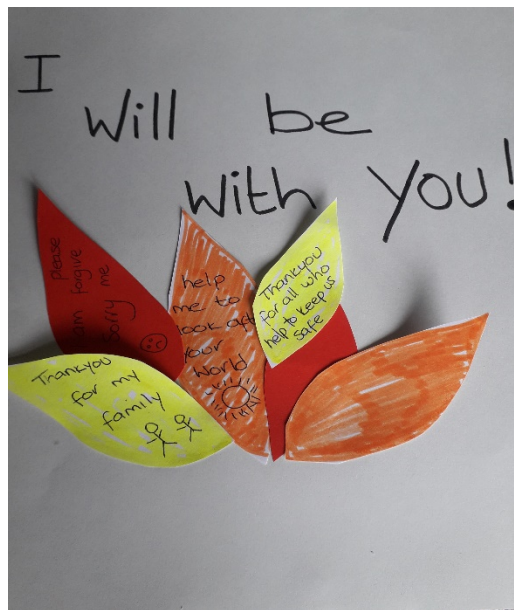
Creative Prayer Activity:

- Glue

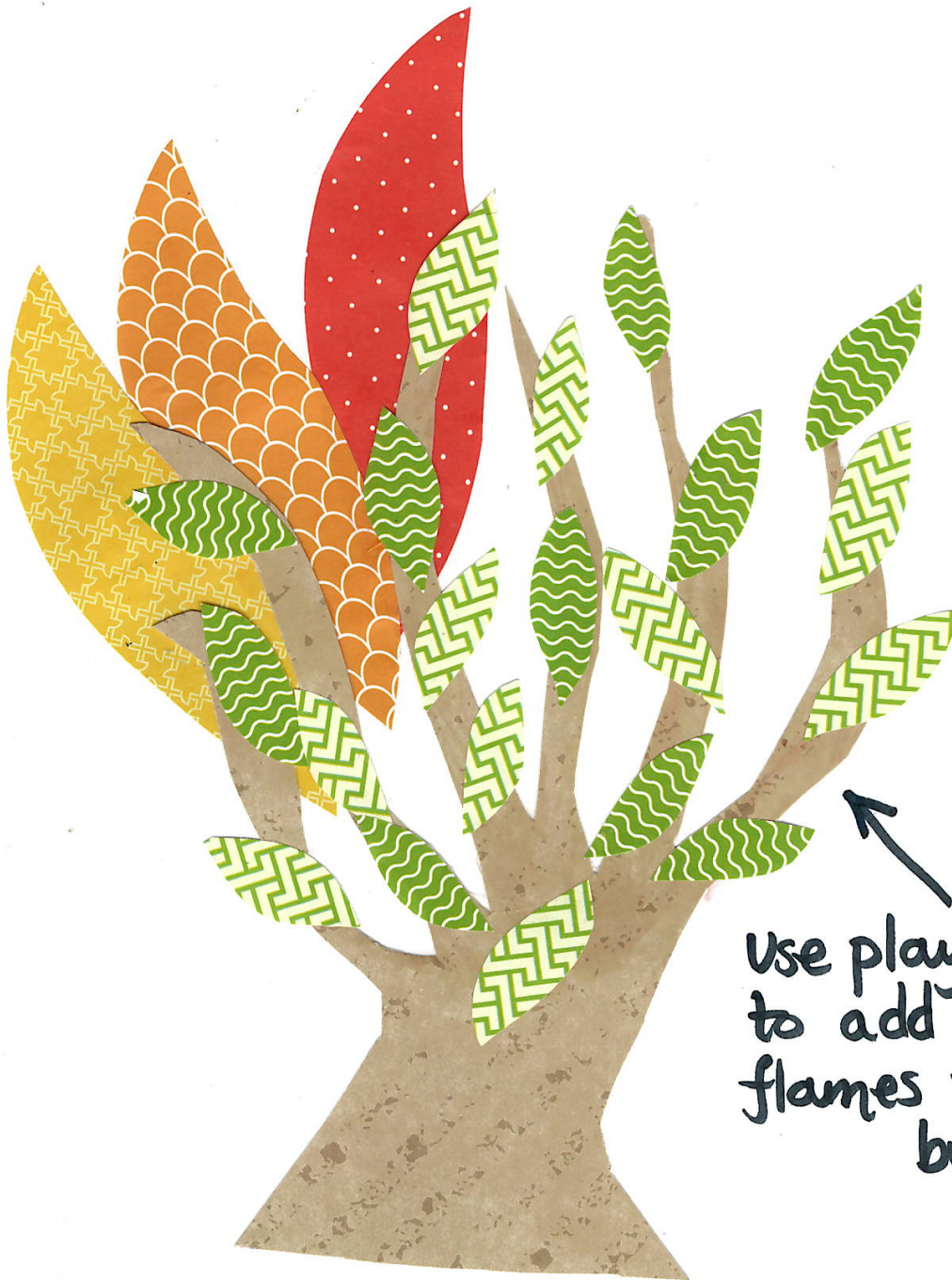
What to do:
