You will need:

- A glass
- Water
- Salt
- Grape

Fill the glass half way with water, add the grape and watch as it sinks to the bottom.

Take the grape out and add two tablespoons of salt to the water stir with a spoon. Add the grape again and watch the grape float!

'Come' called Jesus. So Peter stepped out of the boat and began to walk across the water. Peter began to notice the stirring of a strong wind and got frightened. He started to sink and cried out 'Jesus, save me!' Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him.

Creative Prayer Activity:

You will need:

- Blue cloth/scarf/towel
- Card/Paper
- Pens


Lay the blue cloth on the floor.
